Riverdale Station Park – The Start of Something Spectacular!



he Kingsbridge-Riverdale-Van Cortlandt Development Corporation/KRVC is a not-for-profit organization that aims to encourage and support local initiatives that will build and enrich our community through social, cultural, environmental, health, housing, educational and business enterprises. Our target area is the business and residential community comprised of Kingsbridge, Kingsbridge Heights, Marble Hill, Riverdale, Spuyten Duyvil, Fieldston, Woodlawn and Van Cortlandt Village. KRVC also hosts and organizes a summer movie night series. Hundreds of people attend the movies and are encouraged through our outreach to patronize the local businesses before and after the movies. In addition, KRVC's work includes merchant organizing and "biz boosters" where we partner with local businesses to promote and enrich events and meetings they are

holding.

Beyond all else, KRVC is committed to supporting the responsible development of our community. One development project KRVC has worked extensively on is the Campaign for River Access for Riverdale. Currently, we have a small public riverfront park in our community on 254th Street: Riverdale Station Park, You enter

this tiny park through the Metro North 254th Street Station. It is a beautiful little park with breathtaking views of the Hudson River. It is the start of something spectacular in our community! KRVC is committed to the expansion of this park to the north into Yonkers and to the south into Manhattan for a continuous riverfront greenway in our community that connects up and down the Hudson River. River access would serve to boost our local businesses, enrich our community and provide cultural and recreational opportunities on the river. Currently, KRVC is a lead sponsor of Riverdale RiverFest, a cherished, annual event in our community held at the College of Mount Saint Vincent. RiverFest is a "Celebration of the River" with boat rides. a riverfront concert, interactive children's activities and much more. KRVC has also hosted Movie on the River at the College. We look forward to organizing and hosting more concerts, movies, festivals and more on the river!

Our work would not be possible without our funders. KRVC has been fortunate to receive grants, sponsorships and individual donations from hundreds of supporters. perience**Riverdale** A Greenway on the Horizon

iverdale has a great many things to boast and promote as being "experience-worthy." But stop I the press. It turns out it also has a waterfront vision that when realized will bring an economic windfall to the community and a priceless recreational destination for visitors and residents alike.

The idea of a continuous recreational riverfront path, extending from the Battery all the way to Albany, is not new, but it has shifted into higher gear recently. And in this debate, the Riverdale section of the Bronx is the center of the Greenway universe.

The community has turned its attention to the complex challenge of spanning the Spuyten Duyvil water gap and connecting the existing Hudson River Greenway on the Westside of Manhattan to its natural link in Yonkers, the Old Croton Aqueduct Trail, in a manner that won't bust budgets, tear up bucolic side streets, trample on forever wild parkland and, oh yeah, will get a bureaucracy as intransigent as the MTA to give up an unused waterfront track.

But undeterred forces are as optimistic as they are influential – and as numerous as they are resourceful. The lead advocacy groups and individuals behind the effort are

the Friends of the Hudson River Greenway in the Bronx and its Chair, Paul Elston and the Kingsbridge Riverdale Van Cortlandt Development Corp's (KRVC) ubiquitous Executive Director, Tracy McCabe.

Over the course of 15 years, Mr. Elston has assembled a who's who of Riverdale activists, elected officials and organizations ranging from Schervier Nursing Care Center, Wave Hill, the College of Mount Saint Vincentand The Hebrew Home at Riverdale all would see a portion of the Greenway run through their backyards - to the uber-powerful Senator Charles Schumer. One would think that with such a cast of characters that shovels would already be in the ground.

While there may be some differences of opinion on how to get it done, there is near unanimity on the premise that it must get done. And it must get done on the Riverfront. A proposal by the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC) that studied the feasibility of an alternate inland route floundered after significant public opposition, and the local community board has endorsed the all-waterfront route for the Greenway.

While the all-waterfront route may present more challenges and will undoubtedly

take longer, the eventual payback to the community will be far greater. So says KRVC's Tracy McCabe: "The verdict is already in. The construction of the Greenway in Manhattan has led to an unprecedented cultural, economic and recreational renaissance on the Westside."

Local resident and Chair of the Economic **Development Committee of Community** Board 8, Sergio Villaverde agreed, "Ride a bike or go for a walk along the Hudson River Greenway in Manhattan on a beautiful Spring weekend and it will become plainly evident what Riverdale has to gain from the construction of our Greenway. Income, jobs, family-friendly fun and a reputation as a place where things are happening."

Yael Levy, co-chair of Riverdale Riverfest, an annual festival held on the campus of the College of Mount St. Vincent in North Riverdale to promote waterfront access, echoed that sentiment, "We are expecting 5,000 people who desperately want greater access to their river to attend this year's festival. If we build it, they will come."

Things are most definitely happening in Riverdale.

iverdale is protected as a Special Natural Area District under City law, which preserves it as a particularly green area. Tragically, it has been separated from the Hudson River by the railroad tracks for over 150 years. The only space accessible to the public is the tiny Riverdale Station Park, about 300 feet long and 20 feet wide. The proposed Greenway Link will change that dramatically providing two miles of waterfront access in the Bronx and another mile in Yonkers.

The Hudson River is the defining natural feature of the West Bronx. Riverdale has a great plan to reconnect its residents with the Hudson River with the creation of the Greenway Link - a walking/biking trail on the edge of the Hudson River connecting the Manhattan Hudson River Greenway with the Old Croton Aqueduct trail (a State Park and the designated Westchester Hudson River Greenway Trail). The Greenway Link will put the River back into Riverdale.

The Hudson River Greenway Link is part of an effort by New York State to create a continuous walking and biking trail along the Hudson River which extends from Albany to the southern tip of Manhattan. In 1991 the state

legislature created the Greenway to preserve, enhance and develop the world renowned scenic, natural, historic, cultural and recreational resources of the Hudson River Valley. The Greenway Act also calls for safe access to the River

and a system of trails that will link the towns and cities, parks, natural areas and historic sites along the river. New York City has made great progress in creating a Hudson River Greenway along the entire edge of the Hudson in Manhattan, and Westchester has done the same in Yonkers. A Greenway in the West Bronx will connect these Greenways and communities.

The effort to create the Greenway in the Bronx started over 30 years ago. In 1998 the Bronx Advisory Committee of the Hudson River Valley Greenway concluded a multi-year effort and called for further study of a waterfront trail. In response to a request from the Friends of the Hudson River Greenway in the Bronx (FHRG) in 2004, Senator Schumer provided the funding to develop the plan for the Greenway Link through Federal Transportation legislation. The planning effort began in 2009 under the direction of the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC) in a partnership with the local community and community groups in the Bronx and Yonkers.

The NYMTC has completed that

study and has concluded that a Greenway on the railroad right-of-way on the waterfront is feasible, but that it is institutionally and physically challenging. As you might expect, it is expensive when compared to other Westchester/Upstate Greenway improvements, but inexpensive when compared to the Manhattan Greenway. The proposed waterfront route has been endorsed by Community Board 8, The Bronx.

The next step for implementing the Greenway Link plan is to develop an engineering plan for the waterfront route and to fund construction. All of our elected officials have pledged to support this effort and they continue to be led by the great biking and Greenway enthusiasts, Senator Charles Schumer. The Riverdale Press

headline shouted: "Chuck Schumer vows funding for greenway" in reporting on the press conference held by Schumer with other government officials at the JFK Marina on January 17, 2014.

As a nation, we have made great

progress since the 1972 enactment of the Clean Water Act in cleaning up our waterways. Rivers that served industry and municipalities as open sewers now support healthy fish life and no longer give off noxious odors. This improvement in the quality of our water has led to a significant change in our waterfront. All across our nation, in city after city, the abandoned industrial waterfront that had been left in ruin is being reclaimed by the local communities. Areas that were literally junk yards and often contain toxic waste are being returned to vital and productive uses. Areas that have been abandoned and dangerous are being made secure and being turned into playgrounds for children and adults alike. After 150 years of alienation from the Hudson River, it is time to reclaim access to the waterfront for the people of the Bronx, the City and the State.




OPEN SPACE


